Progression Standards

Criteria for progression into the program

Progression to the educational interpreting concentration requires a 2.7 cumulative GPA after a minimum of 30 semester hours of coursework and completion of Educational Interpreting 223 and 226 with a grade of “B” or better in both courses.

Criteria for progression into the major:

1. Cumulative GPA of 2.7/4.0 or greater for at least 30 semester hours.
2. Grade of “B” or better in the following courses:
Educational Interpreting 223 & 226
3. A Board of Admissions will meet once each fall and spring to review applications and conduct interviews with each applicant.
4. Students must maintain a minimum GPA of 2.7 to remain in good academic standing once admitted to the major. Students who drop below the minimum for two semesters will be advised by letter that they have been dropped from the major.
5. Students who fail to meet the standards for professional conduct during the course of their fieldwork will not be retained in the major.
