Hotel, Restaurant, and Tourism

5. All 300 level Business courses must be taken at UT.

7. Hotel, Restaurant and Tourism Electives are to be selected from: HRT 101(fall/spring), HRT 341(fall only), HRT 423(spring only), HRT 435 (spring only), HRT 440(fall/spring), HRT 445(fall/spring), and HRT 450(fall only).

Students must earn a grade of “C” or better in all Hotel, Restaurant, and Tourism courses.

Progression Standards

Criteria for progression into the program

Students should apply for progression into their major after completing at least three of the following Hotel, Restaurant, and Tourism 210, 211, 212, and 224, and prior to entering Hotel, Restaurant, and Tourism 390. Applications for progression are available in the department office.

Criteria for progression into the major:

1. Cumulative GPA of 2.3/4.0 or greater with a minimum of at least 30 semester hours completed.
2. Grade of “C” or better in the following courses:
All Hotel, Restaurant, and Tourism prefix courses.
3. Completion of English 101-102 and Mathematics 125.
4. Complete 300 post-secondary school hours of industry-related work for the chosen major. A list of appropriate work experiences is available in the department office.

For graduation, students must earn a “C” or better Hotel, Restaurant, and Tourism courses.
