J. Paul Blakely Scholarship 2003 Call for Applications

Entries are now being accepted for the J. Paul Blakely Scholarship. This scholarship is given to a University of Tennessee (UT) student each year by the East Tennessee Chapter of the Society for Technical Communication (STC). The scholarship amount to be awarded in 2003 is \$800.

Applicants must be UT English majors (graduate or undergraduate) enrolled in the technical communication concentration. Entries must include

- Cover letter formally applying for the scholarship
- Resume
- Transcript (an unofficial transcript is acceptable)
- Sample of the applicant's own writing on a technical subject
- Sample of a technical document such as a report, proposal, handbook, newsletter, brochure, Web page (provide URL), or set of instructions to which the applicant has made significant contributions (e.g., editing, writing, designing); an explanation of the applicant's role in preparing the document must be included
- Autobiographical essay (one or two pages) including a description of the applicant's educational and career plans and how those career plans are related to the field of technical communication

Submit three copies of the application in separate large envelopes marked as follows:

“2003 J. Paul Blakely Scholarship”
(Applicant's Name)

These materials should be submitted to Dr. Russel Hirst in the UT Department of English no later than noon on March 3, 2003. You may deliver the applications to the departmental secretaries in 311 McClung Tower, and they will place the applications in Dr. Hirst's mailbox.

The winner will receive the scholarship award at a chapter meeting in April (to be announced).
