6) FORENSIC PSYCHOLOGY

- Who: Bruce Seidner
- *Arrangements*: Three class 90-minute meetings during the semester. The module considers the fundamental diagnostic and adjudicative questions for adolescents and adults. It is the Sermon on the Mount versus Leviticus. What are the legal standards? How do psychologists evaluate competence? What's it like testifying in court? Kaplan's "Farewell to Childhood," and Winnicott's writings figure prominently.
