Lieutenant Colonel Angle is the Commander and Professor of Aerospace Studies, Detachment 800, Air Force Reserve Officer Training Corps (ROTC) at The University of Tennessee, Knoxville, Tennessee. He is responsible for recruiting, educating, training, motivating, selecting and commissioning officer candidates through the Air Force ROTC program at The University of Tennessee. Air Force ROTC provides academic instruction on fundamental Air Force doctrine, practical leadership experience, and extensive field training emphasizing officership and physical fitness to prepare future officers for active duty.

Colonel Angle graduated in 1992 from the University of Mississippi and was commissioned through the Reserve Officer Training Corps. He is a career space officer and has held a variety of operational and staff assignments at the group, wing, and major command levels. He served as Defense Satellite Communications System, Phase III, Satellite Operations Crew Commander, Crew Instructor and also as Deputy Chief of Orbital Analysis for multiple communication satellite platforms. He served as Flight Commander and Operations Officer for the 1st Space Launch Squadron and Senior Evaluator, 45th Operations Group, Cape Canaveral AFS FL. There he personally led four spacelift missions, including the National Aeronautics and Space Administration's Genesis Probe, Mars Rover, and Infrared Telescope, and the first-ever National Reconnaissance Office satellite aboard an Atlas II rocket.



His staff experience includes a Headquarters Air Force Space Command tour. He was Chief, Space Operations Training and then selected in April 2005 to serve as Executive Officer to the Vice Commander, Air Force Space Command. Colonel Angle has commanded a forward deployed unit in combat and served as Operations Officer for an Operations Support Squadron.
