The Reality: Both men and women can be raped (forced to participate in unwanted sexual intercourse), but it happens much more often to women.

- One in five college age women report being forced to have sexual intercourse. *(1995 National College Health Risk Behavior Survey)*
- Approximately 66% of raped women knew their assailant *(2000 N.C.V.S.)*
- A rape is reported once every six minutes in the United States *(2001 F.B.I.)*
- Firearms are used in only 6% of all rapes *(2004 D.O.J.)*
- Victims took self protective measures in 74% of all rapes *(2004 D.O.J.)*
